Weatherization assistance programs

Each U.S. state offers a Weatherization Assistance Program available for households that qualify (such as those that already qualify for Supplemental Security Income, Aid to Families with Dependent Children, and other income eligibility criteria).

This program includes a home energy assessment and help with weatherization upgrades, like attic insulation, and fixing or replacing old water heaters.

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program offers help with home repairs and upgrades based on household size and income.

For example, a four-person household with an annual income of \$39,750 would qualify for LIHEAP and could get a replacement for a broken heating and cooling system through this program.

Housing market: PRICES UP, SALES DOWN

Experts see more of the same in coming months

Existing home sales continued their year-over-year decline as inventories tightened and mortgage rates rose in August, according to the latest report from the Wisconsin Realtors Association.

Wisconsin home sales fell 10.4% over the past 12 months, and the median price rose to \$271,000 in August 2022, which is an increase of 8.4% compared to August 2021.

The prime season for sales of existing homes is between May and August, which accounts for approximately 43% of annual home sales in a typical year, according to the WRA. This year, home sales were down during this peak period. Specifically, 32,293 homes were sold in the May-to-August 2022 period, as compared to 36,096 closed homes during that four-month period in 2021.

Through the first eight months of the year, existing home sales fell 8.7% compared to that same period in 2021, and the median price rose 10.4% to \$265,000. Inventories remained very tight, with months of inventory falling from 3.3 months of supply in August 2021 to just 2.8 months in August 2022. One reason that inventories tightened in August was due to the outpace of homes sold at 8,289 versus the new listings at 8,084

Every region of the state is considered a strong seller's market, with months of supply well below the six-month benchmark

that characterizes a balanced market, according to the WRA. Mortgage rates eased slightly for the second straight month, falling to 5.22% in August, down from 5.52% in June this year but well above the 2.84% level from August 2021.

Overall, the combination of higher home prices and higher mortgage rates led to significantly lower housing affordability in the state, according to the WRA.

The Wisconsin Housing Affordability Index shows the portion of the median-priced home that a buyer with median family income qualifies to buy, assuming a 20% down payment and 30-year fixed-rate mortgage at current rates financing the remaining balance. The index dropped 28.6% from 189 in August 2021 to 135 in August 2022.

Like the rest of the state, home sales were down and median prices up in Kenosha, Racine and Walworth counties.

In the year-to-date comparison with 2021, home sales declined 12.2% in Kenosha County, 4.9% in Racine County and 12.6% in Walworth County.

In the same comparison median home prices were up 8.7% in Kenosha County, 7.6% in Racine County and 10.5% in Walworth County.

Analysis from the experts

Low inventory and declining affordability problems are softening the market

"While there are still motivated buyers in the market and homes continue to move

at a brisk pace, the limited supply and declining affordability have constrained home sales this summer," said Brad Lois, 2022 Chairman of the Board of the WRA. "Unfortunately, we expect these tight supply conditions to continue through the remainder of the year."

Fed fully committed to lowering inflation

"Inflation peaked at 9.1% in June and has moderated only slightly, remaining above 8% in both July and August. The Fed has emphasized its resolve to get inflation rates back to its 2% target, and that translates into aggressively raising short-term interest rates," said Dave Clark, Marquette University Economist and WRA consultant

"As a result, we should expect additional upward pressure on mortgage rates over the next 6 to 12 months. Indeed, the 30-year mortgage rate went over 6% in mid-September for the first time since 2008, and we expect the upward trajectory to continue until inflation eases significantly."

Housing price appreciation will continue at slower pace

"Lower affordability is driving some potential buyers out of the market, and that will likely slow the pace of price appreciation," said Michael Theo, President and CEO of the WRA.

"However, until we move toward a more balanced market, home prices will continue to increase at or near the double-digit pace we've seen year to date."



Protect landscapes from wildlife and more over the winter

Landscapes are vulnerable to the elements during the cold weather months. Everything from de-icing products to hungry animals to the weight of snow can affect trees, shrubs and other plants.

Just because certain greenery will go dormant during the winter doesn't mean landscape maintenance ends when the mercury dips. Homeowners can take certain actions to winterproof their properties and safeguard landscapes so they recover more readily when spring arrives.

Utilize barriers and deterrents

When resources are scarce, animals will be on the hunt for anything that's edible, and that includes whatever greenery is growing on a landscape. Physical barriers in garden beds and around trees can help prevent damage caused by moles, voles and deer. Line the bottom and sides of garden beds with garden cloth to prevent ground-burrowing animals from getting in from beneath, suggests the gardening resource *I Must Garden*.

Wrapping shrubs in burlap or covering them in temporary netting can deter deer, who will seek accessible food sources over

the winter. Erect fencing around new trees to keep deer away from the bark and lower branches.

Make the yard less attractive to deer and burrowers by opting for fat-based suet cakes to feed birds rather than loose seeds and berries in feeders, which herbivores will enjoy. Also, don't overwater or mulch landscapes too early.

The loose soil and warmth of the mulch may entice moles and voles and other rodents to stick around in those areas and feed on plants.

Use a safer melting product

Investigate options in snowmelt products, as traditional rock salt can injure buds and branches and kill lawns. In addition, avoid piling salted snow in one area of the landscape, as it will concentrate the salt in that spot. Spread out snow piles to help minimize the damage to delicate plants.

Secure saplings and juvenile plants

Harsh winds and battering snow can damage young plants. Use stakes and lattices to secure them so they'll be

better able to withstand the weather, suggests Total Landscape Management, a commercial and residential landscaping company.

Promptly remove snow from branches to help trees and shrubs; otherwise, the weight of ice and snow can break off branches and cause irreparable damage.

Erect a snow barrier

Prior observation tends to educate homeowners about which areas of the landscape are most vulnerable to snow drifts and blustery winds. During the winter, winds often blow in from a northeasterly direction, but each homeowner can make his or her own assessment. Put up a tarp between two stakes to serve as a *Osnow fence* that protects vulnerable areas of the landscape from blowing snow.

Keep plants cozy

Wrap plants in burlap, garden blankets and plant domes to insulate them from cold weather and some animals. Move container plants into a garage or shielded area for the winter.

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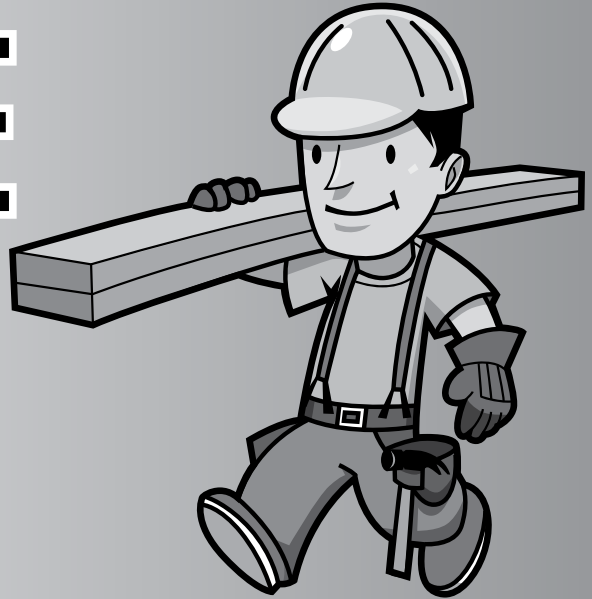
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
