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
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# Wizard's Weekend Day returns June 24

#### New this year

To start the day, adults and children will gather in downtown Antioch dressed as their favorite character. Armed with their wand (or perhaps their smart wand also known as a cell phone) they will be ready to participate in special wizards' fun activities throughout the day. The day will begin with a visit to downtown Antioch, where a search will be made for the Ministry of Magic Information Booth. It is here that the Marauders Map can be obtained with the purchase of the magical band that will allow visitors to enjoy the many magical moments fun activities. The map will identify the magical village shops with their Wizards Weekend Day special identifying names. It will also contain the hours that the various events will take place.

Enjoy the magical craft pop-ups where visitors are certain to find all their wizardly desires. The craft pop-ups are located in the heart of Wizard Village, adjacent to the Ministry of Magic booth. Take the time to shop the magical craft pop-ups for uniquely crafted wizard items to add to your collection.

with the idea of becoming a wizard or witch, will be attendance in the Kids Hogwarts School of Magic. This will not only be the start of their day but most likely the most interesting event of their day, as they participate a variety of classes to hone their wizarding skills.

The students will be sorted into four magical groups, just as they are in Harry Potter's world. In these groups, they will work with others to learn new wizarding or witching skills or to improve the ones they already have.

While each student may have chosen to dress for a different House than the one they are magically sorted into, it is not a problem. They will find their niche in the house that they have been assigned to by the magic sorter. For the magic sorter knows which house they are best suited to enjoy.

The classes include, but are not limited to, Defense Against the Dark Arts, Care of Magical Creatures, and everyone's favorite Broom Flying. Other magical classes are still being developed and will be eagerly added to the schedule.

The classes will begin at 9 a.m. and finish at 11:30 a.m. Check in begins at 8:30 a.m. so that classes will be able to promptly begin at 9 a.m. There is so much to learn and so little time to do so.

It is recommended that students bring their own, or their parents' smart wand (also known as a cell phone) to be used for photos. The regular wand is not needed as they will be provided to the students in class.

The classes are held indoors and students will be picked up by parents at the end of the Kids Hogwarts's School of Magic when they are dismissed after completing their classes.

Tickets for classes are limited and must be purchased ahead of time to secure a spot in the class. They may be purchased either online at www.wizardsweekend.com or at www.antiochchamber. org prior to Wizards Weekend Day.

Register young wizards or witchs soon so they are not disappointed by the class filling up before their applications are received. Just like any school, an acceptance letter will be sent to those who are accepted. These letters will be sent by snail mail so get your application in early so there is ample time for it to be sent to you.

#### Grown up fun

So, what is there for Mom and Dad to do while their children are in class? What else, but shop or if they have purchased their arm band begin to enjoy all the Magical Moments which are available for wizards, witches and muggles of all ages.

Remember it is only the Kids Hogwarts School pf Magic that is limited to those from 7 to 13 years of age.

Begin with a visit to the magical pop-up crafts and enjoy the Wizard Shops in downtown Antioch to make the 2-1/2 hours the children are in classes pass quickly.

While parents may believe they know the downtown shops well, on this day they will have a new look as they develop their magic wizardry looks. The Wizard Village shops will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Plenty of time for shopping and for enjoying the many magical events to be found here.

The afternoon is a busy time on Wizards Weekend Day. The stores in Wizards Village will be open for shopping and to participate in a variety of magical events inside the shops for those who have purchased and are wearing their wristbands.

The Magical Scavenger Hunt which can be completed anytime between 10 am to 3 pm begins by using your magical map as you meander through the downtown magical shops following the spiders to find all seven of the Horcruxes.

At each of the Horcrux items don't forget to use your Collins Camera, perhaps you know it as your cell phone camera, to take a selfie or two of yourself at each Horcrux to prove that you actually found them.

Once you have located each of the Horcrux and taken your selfie there, it is time to take them all over to the Minister of Magic Booth by 3:30 p.m. and share your selfies to be entered into the chance to win a handmade Nimbus 2000 Broom which will be



given to one lucky winner.

New this year is an event specifically for the adults. The Tri Wizard Potion Crawl will begin at 4 p.m. and continue until whenever the party ends. It will start with a kick-off party to meet your favorite Professors or Wizards. There is a separate ticket that must be purchased (by adults only), to participate in the Tri Wizard Potion Crawl. Deadline for purchase of these tickets is June 5.

You will receive the magic band along with the Potion Crawl ticket to enjoy magic moments in the Wizard Village from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and then be ready to join the kick-off party at 4 pm and begin the Wizard Potion Crawl.

CORRESPONDENT spring arrives, we look at our homes with new eyes, viewing what once seemed so bright and fashionable, now appears somewhat dated and in need of

## Size and scale

Kroupa said it isn't only the style and material of the light that is important but the correct scale for the room that must be considered.

A solid fixture may appear to be larger than an open one while in reality the solid one may be inches smaller. To create the perfect lighting size for your room, the staff member working with you, will use a formula to determine the correct size fixture for your space.

"There is no charge to work with you to make these decisions," Kroupa said. "Our goal is to help you make the best decision possible so that you are pleased with your purchases for many years. If you find a picture of a light that you really like, bring it in. They probably have the same picture or one very similar."

handeliers

While crystal chandeliers may be your

dream, many of today's are very different from the drop crystal chandeliers of the past. No longer a need to detach the crystals and wash each one and replace it on the chandelier. No need to replace the many light bulbs that may be included in the fixture.

Today the crystal chandelier is often lit by an integrated LED system. An LED is a light-emitting diode which produces light up to 90% more efficiently than the incandescent bulbs that have traditionally been used. There are no individual bulbs to change.

### (eiling fans

Ceiling fans made their appearance in homes in the 1920s, before home air conditioning, as a way to keep the home cooler during the hot days of summer.

While they declined in use with the appearance of air conditioning in homes, it was not long before homeowners realized that the use of the ceiling fan, along with the air conditioning, allowed them to raise the temperature in the home and still be comfortable as the air is moved around.

Today's fans have a very different look than those original fans. Most of the early fans had five blades, usually large to move the air. Today the ceiling fans have again gained popularity but they are very different from these early fans.

Most of the fans are three- or fourblade fans and although they may be much smaller in size, move more air. Some of the newer fans are surrounded by a light fixture and have clear blades, making them almost invisible

These new style fans are known as fandoliers, because they combine the ceiling fan and the light fixture. They provide an attractive light fixture and still allow for the ceiling fan to move the air. The fans with DC motors are quieter, less wobbly, and move air better.

### amps and more

As customers meander through the store, they will be attracted to a variety of table lamps, floor lamps, side tables, and other decorative accessories to add to the beauty of your home. Some tables have lamps integrated in them. The store also has tables that light up with an integrated LED light along the edges.

"We carry a lot of stained glass fixtures and lamps. We will probably always carry them as they do remain popular with customers," Kroupa said.

The stained glass features, whether hanging fixtures, lamps, or decorative pieces to place on a side table, add color to the room.

# Juldoor spaces

Outdoor lights have also been upgraded. No longer the lamp-shaped light next to the door but an assortment of LED fixture, sleek with clear or frosted glass and black edging that will a new look to outside spaces.

# Blues, Brews & BBQ is no Bands, Brews & BBQ

# More diverse lineup still boasts top local blues artists

The McHenry Area Rotary's chief annual fundraiser has a new name, new top sponsor and a special Sunday feature in the works that club members hope will draw record crowds for the three-day music, food and craft brew fest along the shore of McCullom Lake.

The decision was made going into this year to rename the fest from Blues, Brews & BBQ to Bands, Brews & BBQ. This year's fest will be Aug. 18-20 at Petersen Park.

"The change reflects our desire to appeal to a more diverse, inclusive audience," said Diana Mark, lineup chairwoman for the event. "But those who've been longtime fans should not fear that we're ditching the blues. We're not. With John Todd, Jimmy Nick, Ivy Ford and Kevin Purcell among those in the lineup, we aren't straying far from our roots."

Headlining opening night, on Friday, Aug. 18, after Todd and Nick will be Cadillac Groove, which performs a highenergy variety of southern rock, blues, funk, R&B, soul and more. The fest gates will open at 4:30 p.m. Aug. 18, with musical performances starting at 5 and concluding at 11 p.m.

Saturday's lineup starts with the indomitable, globe-trotting blues kitten Ivy Ford at 4 p.m., followed by The Simple Remedy, billed as "classic Nashville sound mixed with Motown soul." Taking the stage for the evening's final performance on Aug. 19 will be Too Fighters Chicago, a Foo Fighters tribute band.

Sunday's performers will be Wall of Denial, Kevin Purcell & the Nightburners and Two Beer Tommy. Wall of Denial is Chicago's premier Stevie Ray Vaughan tribute band, while Purcell's swamp boogie blues licks are well-loved by the fest's diehard fans, and Two Beer Tommy will bring a country rock conclusion to the musical weekend.

"As the lineup shows, we've also returned to three bands each day, so at \$10 for presale tickets and \$15 at the gate, it's a great value," Mark said.

The entire fest is presented this year by the McHenry Outdoor Theater – Golden



Age Cinemas, whose owner, Scott Dehn, has been a longtime supporter.

"The McHenry Area Rotary does a great job coordinating this festival for the community to enjoy — and to raise money for worthwhile causes," Dehn said. "It's something I've been impressed with for years, and I'm thrilled to take a lead role."

Additionally, this summer's fest features a first-time Sunday all-performance sponsorship by Ray Auto Group and Jeeps on the Run, coupled with a Jeep show.
