

High court: Smell of burnt cannabis is not cause for warrantless vehicle search

State supreme court rules unanimously in case stemming from 2020 traffic stop

Law enforcement officers in Illinois cannot rely on the smell of burnt cannabis alone to justify searching a vehicle without a warrant, the Illinois Supreme Court ruled on Sept.

The decision was unanimous, though Justice Lisa Holder White did not take part in it. Writing for the court, Justice P. Scott Neville pointed to Illinois' landmark 2019 law legalizing recreational cannabis, which decriminalized the possession of the drug up to 30 grams.

"The laws on cannabis have changed in such a drastic way as to render the smell of burnt cannabis, standing alone, insufficient to provide probable cause for a police officer to search a vehicle without a warrant," Neville wrote in a 20-page opinion.

The case stems from September 2020, when Ryan

Redmond was pulled over by more, including no signs guments in a related case foan Illinois State Police trooper on Interstate 80 in Henry County, just east of the Quad Cities. Redmond's license plate was allegedly not properly secured to his vehicle, and he was driving three miles above the speed limit, according to court records.

But during the interaction, the trooper allegedly smelled burnt cannabis in Redmond's vehicle and upon searching the vehicle, he found approximately a gram of cannabis in the car's center console.

Redmond was charged with a misdemeanor for failure to transport cannabis in an odor-proof contain-

trooper's detection of the "burnt cannabis" odor in the vehicle "certainly established reasonable suspicion to investigate further," but noted highway," the opinion said. that the officer's further in-

that Redmond's driving was impaired. Therefore, Neville wrote, the officer's reasonable suspicion should have never advanced to "probable cause to search."

Though the court acknowledged the trooper's initial suspicion that Redmond could've "smoked cannabis in the car at some point" was not out of the realm of possibility, Neville pointed out that the officer not only "observed no signs of impairment" but also found no drug paraphernalia or evidence of cannabis use in the car on further investigation.

The court heard Redmond's vestigation yielded nothing case in January, alongside ar-

cused on the section in Illinois law that requires cannabis be stored in a sealed, odor-proof container if being transported in a car.

In that case, an Illinois State Police trooper pulled over a car for speeding in rural Whiteside County, also near the Quad Cities, and then arrested the passenger of the vehicle for unlawful possession of cannabis. According to court records, Vincent Molina's December 2020 arrest came after the officer found a small box of rolled joints in a vehicle search predicated on the smell of raw cannabis in the car, though Molina told the officer he had a medical cannabis card.

Though the Supreme Court heard the cases in consolidated arguments earlier this year, the justices only ruled on Redmond's case Sept. 19. The decision briefly mentioned the Molina case in a footnote saying the court was not address- citizenry." ing "the validity of the odorproof container requirement" in the Redmond decision.

Ahead of the joint oral arguments in January, national and state-level chapters of the American Civil Liberties Union and the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers filed a brief in support of Molina and Redmond, writing that allowing the odor of cannabis as cause for searching a vehicle will lead to biased enforcement against Black and Latino Illinoisans. "There is a decades-long pattern of police in this state using pretext like cannabis odor to disproportionately stop and search Black and Latino

The Sept. 19 opinion also noted that other states agree, holding up a Kansas Supreme Court decision from earlier this year as an example. High courts in other states, including Minnesota, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Vermont have ruled similarly, though Wisconsin's Supreme Court decided the opposite in a 2023 ruling.

Other states have also passed laws prohibiting warrantless searches of vehicles based solely on the smell of cannabis. But a similar effort in Illinois stalled last year as the Redmond and Molina cases were pending.

Virginia Street in Crystal Lake.

These clinics are by appointment only, and registration is available online at bitl. lv/mcac-clinics. Residents with questions can call (815) 459-6222.

Cash is the only form of payment accepted at the clinics. Clinics are available for both cats and dogs, and will be offered on the following days and hours:

- Tuesday, October 1, 1 p.m. (dogs only)
- Tuesday, October 8, 1 4 p.m. (cats only)

Special package pricing is being offered for fixed (spayed or neutered) animals. All animals attending one of the clinics will be microchipped unless a previous microchip is registered or scanned during the event.

Special package pricing for fixed (spayed or neutered) an-

- Dogs: Microchip, 1-year vaccination and registration
- Dogs: Microchip, 3-year vaccination and registration

Intact animals (not spayed or neutered) can still attend the clinics, with the costs being \$15 for a 1-year vaccination and \$30 for a 3-year vaccination. Registration is a separate fee. Intact animals receiving a vaccination will also receive a free microchip unless previously microchipped.

All dogs must be leashed, and all cats must be in an approved carrier when arriving for their appointments. Please do not bring animals that are in heat. Information about bite history for dogs that are easily stressed will be requested when making an appointment. Owners are responsible for putting a muzzle on any dog that needs one prior to their appointment.

We strongly urge adults to educate children about avoiding contact with unfamiliar animals and to immediately inform an adult if they are bitten or scratched by an animal. Any animal bites or encounters with animals suspected of having rabies should be reported to the MCAC at (815) 459-6222.

Old McHenry Crossings project moves toward design phase

Lake County Board approves joint resolution to enter into an agreement for phase II

The engineering design contract for a new grade separation and several other related improvements as part of the Lake County Division of Transportation's (LCDOT) Old McHenry Crossings Project, brings it one step closer to reality. On September 10, the Lake County Board approved a joint resolution to enter into an agreement for Phase II engineering design services for the project.

The Old McHenry Crossings Project proposes to construct a grade separation of Old McHenry Road at the Canadian National railroad tracks, improve the Fairfield Road and Midlothian Road intersections, upgrade Quentin Road by adding travel lanes and a new traffic signal at Highland Drive and implement non-motorized improvements throughout the entire project limits

"Our continued investments in transportation allow us to make impactful improvements for our residents and visitors, providing safe walking and biking paths while decreasing congestion," said Sandy Hart, Lake County Board Chair. "Old McHenry Crossings is one of the largest projects that the Lake County Division of Transportation has ever undertaken.'

Now that the project is in Phase II, it's considered to be in the middle of three engineering phases that start with Planning (Phase I) and end with Construction (Phase III). During phase II, construction plans are prepared, permits and other regulatory approvals are obtained and the property and easements necessary to build The Old McHenry Crossing Project is projected to cost about \$150 million, including all engineering phases and construction. Due to the size and complexity of the project, construction is planned to take place in three stages, with the first stage starting as soon as 2027, depending on project readiness, land acquisition and funding availability.

"The focus will now be on lining up critical funding for the project," said Jennifer Clark, Lake County Public Works and Transportation Committee Chair and District 15 Board Member. "Lake County is applying for federal funds that will assist with the project being ready to begin construction as soon as the Phase II design in completed.

Nearly 30,000 vehicles pass through the Old McHenry Crossings corridor each day. Four highly traveled regional highways converging to this area, frequent freight trains and three closely spaced intersections along Old McHenry Road have resulted in high traffic volumes and delays. Nearly 370 crashes have occurred in this area over the last five years. For these reasons, the corridor has been identified in Lake County's 2040 Transportation Plan, which recommends improvements necessary to address the future transportation needs of Lake County.

"This proposed project will be crucial to improve safety, increase connectivity and reduce traffic delays for many motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists who use Old McHenry Road day," said Jessica Vealitzek, Lake County Board Member District 10. "Particularly exciting will be the new grade separation at the railroad tracks, which will mean that motorists will no longer have to sit and wait for the nearly 20 trains that pass through the area each

LCDOT held a number of public meetings to introduce the Old McHenry Crossings Project, collect input from residents and explain the preferred alternative. More than 200 residents attended the last public meeting and dozens have provided feedback in-person and online at omxproject.com.

MCDH reports first West Nile Virus related death since 2018

The McHenry County Department of Health (MCDH) is saddened to report that an individual previously diagnosed with West Nile Virus (WNV) in McHenry County has passed away. The individual, who was in their 80s, developed symptoms in August and later succumbed to first WNV-related death in McHenry County since 2018.

There is no vaccine or treatment for WNV. Mild symptoms can be relieved with rest, fluids, and overthe-counter medications for pain and fever. Seek medical attention if you or an individual you know develops severe symptoms.

The MCDH reminds residents to protect themselves from mosquito-borne illnesses. Culex mosquitoes typically breed in stagnant water with high organic content, often found in artificial containers like rimless tires, abandoned swimming pools, buckets, bird baths, and clogged gutters.

The first and best defense against mosquito-borne illness is to eliminate potential mosquito breeding sites on your property by emptying standing water from containers around your home and ensuring doors and windows have tight-fitting screens.

Williams arrested after fleeing from deputies, confronting them where he abandoned vehicle

On September 19, at approximately 10:15 p.m., a Lake County Sheriff's Deputy was conducting speed enforcement in the area of Route 41 and Wadsworth Road in Wadsworth. The deputy observed a Ford pickup truck traveling southbound at a very high speed. The deputy clocked the Ford at 104 mph in a 50 mph zone.

The deputy conducted a traffic stop and spoke to the an incident that occurred on driver, identified as Austin M. Williams, 47, of the 5100 block of Red Pine Avenue, Gurnee. While speaking to Williams, the deputy informed him that he needed to exit his vehicle. Instead of complying, Williams fled in his vehicle at a high rate of speed. The deputy lost sight of Williams' Ford as he fled westbound on Stearns School Road in Gurnee.

Lake County Sheriff's Telecommunicators alerted area police departments of the incident. At approximately 11:10 p.m., Gurnee Police Officers located the Ford Williams had been driving, unoccupied, in the area of Red Pine Avenue and Alpine Court in Gurnee. Sheriff's deputies responded and requested a tow truck for the Ford.

When the tow truck arrived at the scene, a juvenile approached on foot. The ju-Ford and demanded to drive tiple rounds with the single t away from the scene claiming it was his and not involved in any previous incident. Sheriff's deputies repeatedly told the juvenile he needed to leave and go home; however, the juvenile refused. Sheriff's deputies then placed the juvenile into custody.

He walked toward the scene with his fists clenched and was told by sheriff's deputies to stop. When Williams refused to follow their directions, a sheriff's deputy grabbed hold of his arm. Williams aggressively pulled his arm away from the deputy and continued moving toward the scene. Sheriff's deputies deployed

Williams was transported to the Lake County Jail and charged with the following misdemeanors: Resisting a Peace Officer, Obstructing a Peace Officer, Reckless Driving, Aggravated Speeding (104 mph in a 50 mph zone), Speeding in a Construction Zone, and Fleeing and Elud-

Williams was processed at the jail and released. He is due in court on November 6. All defendants are presumed innocent unless proven guilty in a court of law.
