## Fun gift exchange ideas

Gift-giving is a significant component of the holiday season. Families can embrace traditional gift-giving, but those who want to add a touch of whimsy to gatherings with loved ones can consider these five creative and fun ways to exchange gifts.

When doubles are made, that person passes the dice to the left and starts their own attempts to get at the gifts in the plastic ball.

The game ends when all the gifts are revealed, whether everyone has had a chance to unwrap or not.

A white elephant exchange is like a secret grab bag. Everyone brings a wrapped gift and takes turns choosing a gift based on the number they've been



given.

When the gift is chosen, the person opens it. The next player can select a fresh gift or steal one of the presents that has already been opened.



people on holiday shopping lists may be assigned a higher value than others.

For example, you wouldn't necessarily spend the same amount on a gift for a child's teacher as you would for a grandmother.

Putting a dollar figure next to each name on the shopping list helps you identify your expected spending and where you can cut back, if necessary.

• Establish your overall budget. Once you have an idea of your potential holiday expenditures, set a firm budget.

Avoid the temptation of impulse buys, which can make it easy to go over budget.

• Begin shopping early. Start scouring ads and looking for deals prior to the big sale days.

Keep a running list of gift ideas and when the price is right, purchase those items.

• Price check "perfect gifts." If you've spotted the perfect gift for someone but it's beyond budget, see if you can find a better price elsewhere, says Better Money Habits.

There are apps that allow users to scan barcodes and check items across various retailers. Many stores also have price-match policies that can save shoppers money.

• Look for deals all the time. Many people get hung up on perceived deep discounts from special holiday sales.

However, industry experts say there often isn't a huge difference in markdowns between these promotions and those during other sales.

Some retailers even increase prices on goods only to mark them down later to make it appear that there is a discount.

Only by knowing the average price for items can you know if a sale is legitimate.

• Sign up for store rewards. If you don't want your regular email inbox inundated with offers, set up a separate email account for in-store and online shopping.

Then you can sign up for the rewards programs at checkout. Utilize the coupon codes and advertisements for sales to save money without having your primary email data shared with other marketers.

• Track spending carefully. If you don't know how much you're spending, then you cannot possibly stick to a budget.

After each purchase, keep a running tally of all holiday spending to see how far you are from the finish line.

The holiday season is a joyous time of year, but it can also throw your wellness routines out of alignment. Doctors advise prioritizing healthy choices during this period, so you can start 2025 on the right foot.

The American Medical Association recommends taking these steps during the holidays:

Vaccines are a safe and remarkably effective defense from a number of serious respiratory viruses that circulate in the fall and winter.

To protect yourself and your family, get up to date on your vaccines, including the annual flu shot, as well as the updated COVID-19 vaccine for everyone 6 months and older.

Vaccines are also available to protect older adults from severe RSV. Tools to protect infants during RSV season include maternal vaccination as well as the monoclonal antibody immunization.

If you have questions, speak with your physician and take the time to review trusted resources, including getvaccineanswers.org.

Watch what you eat. Pay particular attention to labels and avoid processed foods as much as you can, especially those with added sodium and sugar.

Consider having a healthy snack before the big meal or offer to bring a healthier dish for the holiday spread.

Drink water instead of sugar-sweetened beverages and eat nutritious, whole foods like fresh fruits and vegetables alongside richer holiday fare.

Stick to your exercise schedule and • prioritize physical activity during this busy time of year.

A good rule of thumb for adults is at least 150 minutes a week of moderateintensity activity or 75 minutes a week of vigorous-intensity activity.

Brisk walks, bike rides, hikes, and even family-friendly sports like basketball and touch football are good for heart health.

Use time with relatives to find out whether your family has a history of type 2 diabetes or cardiovascular disease and whether other family members have been told they have pre-diabetes.

With this information, you can better understand your risk and take charge of your health.

Prioritize your mental health. Factors like holiday spending and navigating time with extended family can bring on extra seasonal stress.

You can help manage stress by getting sufficient sleep, exercising, and seeking help from a mental health professional when you need it.

Make smart choices and plan ahead if **0.** you're driving. During the monitoring of a recent December, more than 1.000

Americans died in alcohol impaired-driving crashes.

Do not drive under any circumstances if you intend to drink. And if you are the designated driver, make a 100% commitment to sobriety.

Be prepared when traveling. Whether you're flying or taking a road trip, you might be tempted to grab convenient, unhealthy food for the journey.

Consider packing your own snacks, such as fresh fruits and vegetables or small portions of dried fruits and nuts.

Get your New Year's resolutions **U** started early. Speak with your doctor or health care professional about quitting tobacco and nicotine use and declare your home and car smoke-free to eliminate secondhand smoke exposure.

Commit to getting exercise daily, even if it's just a brisk walk outside.

"Everyone's holiday wish is to be happy, healthy, and safe, but the season is often a time for overindulgence in food and drink, increased stress, and exposure to respiratory illness," says Bruce A. Scott, M.D., president of the American Medical Association. (STATEPOINT)

## It's estimated one in five people wait until December to start

Shoppers who wait until the eleventh hour to do their holiday shopping are in good company.

Consolidated Credit says one in five shoppers waits until December to start grabbing holiday gifts.

Although shopping early to land the best deals and avoid the stress of running out of time works for many people, there are those who do their best work when shopping is down to the wire.

If you're thinking of being a last-minute Larry or Lucy in regard to your holiday shopping, there are some ways to make late shopping successful.
