



McHenry County Division of Transportation announces new pavement management data collection project

McHenry County pleased to announce the comproject for 2025. This initiative is part of the County's ongoing commitment to maintaining a detailed Pavement Management System. The initiative represents the comprehensive pavement distress and defect evaluations performed by the County. "McHenry County has a long-standing commitment to maintaining our roadways through a data-driven approach" commented Darrell Kuntz, McHenry County's Assistant County Engineer. "This latest cycle of pavement inspection is a continuation of our efforts to ensure that our infrastructure continues to improve. By leveraging advanced technologies and high-quality data, we can make more informed decisions about the locations and prioritizations of our pavement rehabilitation and preservation projects. We anticipate that this project will lead to further improvements in our roadway repair decision-making process, ultimately benefiting our residents and ensuring that we are responsible stewards of

taxpayer funds.' Michael Baker International, Inc. (Michael Baker) from Chicago has been selected to complete the detailed pavement data collection. Utilizing their Advanced Transportation Linear Inspection System (ATLIS) vehicles, Michael Baker will employ state-of-the-art technology, including 3D laser scanners, pavement profiling lasers, ultra-high-definition cameras, and high-accuracy navigation systems to gather current conditions of all County-maintained roadways. Important for our residents, the data collection will be conducted at traffic

speeds, which will result in

Lake County unveils new regional facility to strengthen emergency preparedness and response


After more than a decade of planning and coordination, regional 9-1-1 consolidation partners and federal, state and local officials gathered today to celebrate the completion of the Lake County Regional Operations and Communications (ROC) Facility, a central hub that will strengthen 9-1-1 services and emergency response across the county.

The ROC is over 37,000 square feet and is located on Lake County's Libertyville campus. It will house three major operations:

- · LakeComm, a consolidated 9-1-1 emergency communications center
- The Joint Emergency Telephone System Board (JETSB) of Lake County, which receives 9-1-1 surcharge funds and provides operational oversight of the overall 9-1-1 system
- The Lake County Emergency Management Agency (LCEMA) and its Emergency Operations Center, which coordinates emergency and disaster planning and response

For many years, public safety entities in Lake County explored the idea of combining 9-1-1 dispatch centers, known as public safety answering points (PSAPs), to reduce call transfers, improve coordination and share information more easily. That effort led to the creation of LakeComm, which will serve as the consolidated 9-1-1 emergency communications center for 30 police and fire/ EMS agencies.

The ROC stands as a powerful example of what can be achieved when all levels of government work together with a common goal," said Sandy Hart, Lake County



LakeComm will be utilizing the computer software system rolled out for local law enforcement and fire/ EMS agencies last year. The technology consolidated more than 15 systems into a single, integrated package. This includes Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), records management and law enforcement reporting.

"As a firefighter and EMT for 24 years, I've seen firsthand how even slight delays in response can impact lives," said J. Kevin Hunter, JETSB of Lake County Chair and Lake County Board Member for District 5. "Launching this new software system was a key part of 9-1-1 consolidation. It created a shared. standardized foundation that will improve response times, coordination and information sharing across all agencies."


LCEMA will utilize the space to prepare and train Lake County and local communities for major storms, disasters and countywide emergencies. During emergencies, LCEMA activates the Emergency Operations Center, where partners from across the state and county, such as the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and the Red Cross, come to coordinate resources for people in need.


The ROC is designed to withstand severe weather events, including tornadoes and long-term power outages. It is Lake County Government's first Net-Zero building, meaning the facility will consume no more energy than is produced from renewable sources. It is powered by more than 1,900 solar panels and is heated and cooled using a geothermal energy system of

56 wells located 400 feet below ground.

The ROC was funded by a \$30 million Lake County General Obligation Bond and additional monies contributed via Lake County's Capitol program and the American Rescue Plan Act, a \$5 million Lake County Emergency Telephone System Board commitment, \$2 million from the Illinois Clean Energy Communities Foundation Grant and a \$1 million Emergency Operations Center Grant obtained by Congressman Brad Schneider.

"This day is about more than a building; it's the fulfillment of a commitment to invest wisely in the safety and well-being of our residents," said Patrice Sutton, Lake County Administrator. "The project's completion stands as a testament to every contributor, beginning with the Lake County Board, whose collaborative approach was rooted in sound fiscal planning and long-term investment.

Bailey sentenced to seven years for criminal sexual assault

State's Attorney Randi Freese announces that on July 1, Joshua Bailey, 28, of Kenosha, Wisconsin, was sentenced to seven years in the Illinois Department of Corrections on one count of Criminal Sexual Assault, a Class 1 fel-



ony. The sentence was handed down by the Honorable Judge Mark Gerhardt after Bailey entered a negotiated plea of guilty to the charge.

In November 2024, multiple videos of Bailey having sex with an unconscious victim were discovered. With the assistance of the victim, detectives from the McHen-Department were able to de-County Sheriff's Police termine the locations where the various assaults had occurred. Bailey was charged in the states of Illinois and Wisconsin for the assaults. The charge in Wisconsin is still pending.
