SIG arrests Waukegan man for drug trafficking

The Lake County Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Group (SIG), a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) funded task force, concluded an investigation that resulted in the arrest of a Waukegan man for drug trafficking

SIG began the investigation after developing information that Agustin Arias, Jr., 41, of the 900 block of Woodlawn Avenue, Waukegan, was selling narcotics. SIG detectives initiated an undercover operation and discovered Arias was selling cocaine in Lake Coun-

During the investigation, Arias sold drugs to undercover detectives several times, within 500 feet of an elementary school. On July 17, 2025, sheriff's detectives took Arias into custody, following a traffic stop.

stances the investigation, Lake County State's Attorney's Office approved the charges of three of counts

delivery of a controlled substance within 500 feet of a school.

The Lake County State's Attorney's Office filed a petition to detain Arias in custody while awaiting trial. The petition was granted by the Court following a detention hearing.

Arias remains in the Lake County Jail. His next scheduled court date is August 6, 2025, at 1:30PM in courtroom T020.

Offending vehicle identified in fatal Beach Park hit-and-run

Lake County Sheriff's Traffic Crash Investigators are asking for the community's assistance in locating the identified offending vehicle in the hit-and-run crash that took the life of Adrian Rogel-Villanueva, of Waukegan.

Sheriff's crash investigators have identified the vehicle as a maroon 2017 GMC Sierra pickup truck. The GMC is believed to be currently garaged or at a body repair shop somewhere. The GMC would have front-end damage and damage to the passenger side.

Crash investigators believe the owner removed the license plates, so it's possible it has no plates or plates that

do not match the vehicle. The GMC might have two decals on the top of the rear window, however, those may have been removed by the owner.

The photos contained in this news release contain photos of the actual GMC involved in the crash. Flock safety cameras played a significant role in helping develop leads in this fatal hit-andrun traffic crash.

Waukegan man arrested for drug trafficking

The Lake County Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Group (SIG), a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) funded task force, concluded an investigation that resulted in the arrest of a Waukegan man for drug trafficking.

SIG began the investigation after developing information that Carlton Thomas, 47, of the 200 block of South Victory Street, Waukegan, was selling narcotics. SIG detectives initiated an undercover operation and discovered Thomas was selling crack cocaine in Lake Coun-

Following the investigation, SIG detectives obtained a search warrant for Thomas' home, which was executed on July 22, 2025. Just prior to conducting the search warrant, SIG detectives observed Thomas leaving his home in a vehicle and conducted a traffic stop on him. Thomas was found to be in possession of just under five grams of crack cocaine when arrested.

During the search warrant of Thomas' home, SIG detectives located nearly 10 grams of crack cocaine, over 2,500 grams of cannabis, and two firearms.

After reviewing the facts and circumstances of the investigation, the Lake County State's Attorney's Office approved the following charges:

The Lake County State's Attorney's Office filed a petition to detain Thomas while awaiting trial. He remains held in the Lake County Jail pending a detention hearing this afternoon.

the motorcycle, a 2007 Suzuki GSXR600 was traveling southbound Asia Ricks on Green Bay Road. According to witnesses, the motorcycle operator

was traveling at an excessively fast speed. As the motorcycle was traveling southbound, a 2022 Kia Rio, operated by a 28-year-old man of Beach Park, was making a left turn from northbound Green Bay Road onto westbound Chaplin Street. As the Kia turned, the motorcycle struck

the passenger side of the Kia, and the driver of the motorcycle was thrown and sustained fatal injuries. Crash investigators learned Jordan Ricks lied about being the driver of the Kia at the time of the crash, and Asia Ricks falsely claimed to be a passenger.

The investigation revealed the siblings fabricated the story because Asia was likely under the influence of alcohol at the time of the crash and did not want to be held accountable for her actions.

Both individuals surrendered themselves to the Lake County Jail on July 28. Both appeared in court and are due back on Aug. 28.

Crash investigators concluded Steven McKnight, Jr., 25, of the 900 block of Countrywood Drive, Zion, was driving under the influence of cannabis and recklessly at the time of the crash. McKnight, Jr. did not have his two-year-old son or five-year-old son in any sort of restraining device while Both children sustained horrific injuries, and un-

The Lake County State's Attorney's Office filed a petition to detain McKnight, Jr. while awaiting trial. The Court granted that petition and McKnight, Jr. was remanded to the Lake County Jail pending his next court date of August 7,

Serious unincorporated Grayslake traffic crash

Lake County Sheriff's Traffic Crash Investigators are investigating n morning crash in unincorporated Grayslake resulting in one driver sustaining life-threatening injuries.

On July 27, 2025, at approximately 7:00 a.m., Lake County Sheriff's Deputies responded to Route 60 and Fairfield Road, for a traffic cash with injuries. Sheriff's deputies arrived and located two vehicles with heavy damage.

A preliminary investigation shows a Volkswagen Atlas, driven by a 32-year-old woman of Volo, was traveling eastbound on Route 60. As she approached Fairfield Road, witnesses reported she failed to stop at a red light and struck a southbound Nissan Pathfinder, driven by a 42-year-old woman of Round Lake, in the intersection. The impact of the crash caused the vehicles to then strike a traffic light

The driver of the Volkswagen was transported to an area hospital with critical, life-threatening injuries. The driver of the Nissan and two passengers in the Nissan were transported to an area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

The crash remains under investigation by the Lake County Sheriff's Office Technical Crash Investigations Team.

ake Zurich man arrested in child pornography case

Cybercrime Investigators from the Lake County Sheriff's Office and Lake County State's Attorney's Office arrested a Lake Zurich man for possessing numerous videos and images of child pornography, many involving children as young toddlers.

Cybercrime Investigators from the Lake County Sheriff's and State's Attorney's Offices received information that an electronic device in Lake County was being used for the purpose of downloading and sharing child pornography. Investigators conducted an investigation and through legal process, learned the device was likely coming

from a residence in the 800 block of Interlaken Drive, Lake Zurich.

Investigators applied for and obtained search warrant for the

residence, which was conducted on July 24, 2025. Lake County Sheriff's Office Electronic Detection Canine Enzo and Lake County State's Attorney's Office Electronic Detection Canine Grip assisted with the search. During the search, electronic devices belonging to Randall R. Grueb, 59, of the same address, were seized and analyzed.

The investigation and analysis revealed Grueb likely downloaded thousands of images of child pornography over recent months, with videos and images of children from the ages of toddlers to teens being sexually abused. He was still in possession of over 100 of those images and videos downloaded.

After reviewing the facts and circumstances of the investigation, the Lake County State's Attorney's Office approved the following charges:

Ten Counts of Possessing Child Pornography of Children Under the Age of 13. Additional charges are possi-

Lake County Sheriff John D. Idleburg said, "Our Cybercrime Unit remains relentless in identifying and arresting those who exploit children online. Possessing and distributing child pornography is a horrific crime, and we will continue working with our local, state, and federal partners to ensure these predators are held accountable. There is no place for this behavior in our community."



Scott Krueger sentenced to seven years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for dissemination of child pornography

McHenry County State's from May of 2020 through torney Randi L. Freese July of 2023, Detective Attorney Randi L. Freese announces that on July 25, 2025, Scott Krueger, 52, of Lake in the Hills, Illinois, was sentenced to seven years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for the offense of Dissemination of Child Pornography, a Class X felony. The sentence was handed down by the Honorable Judge Tiffany Davis after Krueger entered a negotiated plea of guilty.

The Algonquin Police Department began investigating Krueger in May of 2020 when the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) forwarded a tip they had received regarding a KIK social messaging account sharing images of child pornography. Through investigation spanning

between 3 years to natural life. As part of his sentence, Krueger will also be required to register as a sex offender for the rest of his natural life.

State's Attorney Freese thanks the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the Algonquin Police Department, and Detective Skrodzki for their thorough investigation and assistance in prosecuting this case. "Exploiting children online will not be without consequences. We remain committed to working with all our law enforcement agencies to identify and hold accountable all those that engage in this predatory behavior," Freese said.

Food prices follow inflation uptick; beef hits record high

By Rhiannon Branch

After a few months of a downward trend, inflation is on the rise again with food prices following suit.

The latest Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 0.3 percent in June and 2.7 percent in the past 12 months.

Food prices rose faster than overall inflation. The CPI for all food increased 0.3 percent from April to May, with food prices in May 2.9 percent higher than a

Prices for beef and veal jumped 8.6 percent higher in May compared to a year ago. Overall, beef and veal prices are predicted to increase 6.8 percent this year due to tight supplies and continued consumer demand.

'U.S. demand for beef has remained strong even as prices hit record highs," said Bernt Nelson, American Farm Bureau Federation economist, who noted the domestic cattle supply is at a 74-year low.



Meanwhile, pork prices rose 0.7 percent from April to May and were 0.6 percent higher than in May 2024. Pork prices are predicted to increase a modest 0.5 percent in 2025. In contrast to beef, pork production is projected to increase this year.

"It is a bit of a delicate balance and especially with all the global uncertainty, more measured (pork) production growth is probably beneficial in these times,' said Erin Borrer of the U.S. Meat Export Federation.

Retail egg prices decreased for the second month in a row, falling 7.5 percent. Egg prices in May were still 41.5 percent higher than in May 2024, continuing to experience volatile month-to-month changes due to an outbreak of highly compared with earlier in the

Egg prices are predicted to increase 33.2 percent in 2025, which includes price increases already realized from January through March 2025. USDA reported that even if retail egg prices continue to decrease over the coming months, higher prices realized earlier in the year will continue to factor into the forecast.

at about the historical average rate of growth. This year prices for all food are predicted to increase 2.9 percent with food-at-home prices up 2.2 percent and food-away-from-home prices up 3.9 percent. Prices for poultry, sugar and sweets and nonalcoholic beverages are predicted to increase, while prices for items like fresh vegetables are expected to ease.

USDA data shows farmers both made and paid more for products in May.

The index of prices received for May rose 1.7 percent due to gains in categories like cattle, hogs and milk, that offset losses in categories like broilers, market eggs, lettuce, and strawberries.

The index of prices paid was up 0.4 percent as increased costs for categories like feeder cattle, hay and forages and nitrogen canceled out decreases in some categories including feeder pigs, self-propelled machinery, LP gas and complete feeds.

Compared to a year ago, the index of prices received was 13 percent higher thanks to a boost in livestock prices, while the index of prices paid was up 6.4 percent.
